Larry is the youngest of three children from an interfaith family raised in the Crown Heights section of Brooklyn.

From childhood, Judaism was very important to him. After arranging to meet with Rabbi Friedman from a Crown Heights synagogue at age twelve, Larry told his parents he wanted to study to become a Bar Mitzvah. When his parents agreed, he studied three days a week for a year and a half to accomplish his goal.

Larry was called to the Torah as a Bar Mitzvah at Temple Ahavath Shalom (Avenue R Temple). Having many friends in the neighborhood, he remained active in the temple youth group where Larry and Linda met in 1969 and subsequently married 50 years ago at that same synagogue.

Synagogue life has remained an important part of life for the Hanibal family from their first Brooklyn congregation to Temple Israel Reform Congregation of Staten Island which they joined in 1987. Larry and Linda's children Brian and Rachel were raised and educated at Temple Israel through Confirmation.

Larry chose to join the Adult Confirmation class of 1994-1995; the same year, Brian was in the Religious School Confirmation class. Nice father-son bond. Larry has served Temple Israel on the Board of Trustees as well as on the executive board for many years. Then came his dedication to fund raising via the Gift Certificate Program. Many of you know that he expanded the gift certificate offerings from the island grocery stores to dozens of options. Then Larry began to personalize the delivery of the certificates so that the program could continue through the COVID pandemic lockdown. It has brought in a steady stream of funds.

His commitment to Judaism and Temple Israel is a given when one thinks of Larry Hanibal, but anyone who knows him, knows that Dad and Grandpa are the two most important titles he has ever held or ever will.

Jim and his wife Nina joined Temple Israel in 1998. They were looking for a place where they and their daughter Elizabeth could worship together. Except for occasional interruptions, they have been at Friday night services ever since. When Nina's family was unable to come to Elizabeth's Bat Mitzvah after the events of

September 11, the whole congregation came forward to help. It is this feeling of a temple family that Jim believes makes our congregation so special.

Jim is a longtime member of Brotherhood, and he has participated in many Sukkah construction crews. He played King Achashverosh for many Purim spiels and has occasionally served as an usher for services. He has served on more than a few nominating committees for temple leadership. He has been an active member of many Cantorial search committees. But his favorite activity has always been music.

Jim was recruited to join the choir where he still sings bass. He became a percussionist for the Rock of Israel Band and often also plays percussion at Friday night services. When there was no music for Tot Shabbat, he began regularly playing guitar for that service.

When Temple Israel began using student cantors whose contracts ended with their school year, Jim stepped up and began playing for summer services eight years ago. He has also played the Sunday morning learning service and the Saturday morning service on occasion. He currently acts as the song leader and plays guitar for those Friday nights when Cantor Bernstein is not singing.

Jodi & Alan met when they were both teaching at John Dewey High School in Brooklyn. It was hate at first sight, but they managed to overcome their initial loathing to create a wonderful loving partnership both professionally and personally for the past 37+ years. This partnership resulted in

many fabulous theatrical productions and Jesse, one absolutely incredible daughter. Upon joining Temple Israel in 1993, they immediately found their Jewish home. Jesse found sisters and brothers and more moms and dads than she can count and Alan and Jodi found a way to fill up every single second of spare time they might ever have had.

Alan and Jodi are both career educators. Alan served as a teacher, assistant principal and principal with the New York City Board/Department of Education for 38 years, retiring as Principal of Lafayette High School in 2005. His career continued with Citibank and then, as an Educational

Consultant. Jodi taught high school for 20 years before being lured to the Superintendent's/Regional Office where she served multiple schools in multiple boroughs as a Lead Instructional Mentor, Achievement Coach and Leadership Development Specialist. She and Alan are both currently enjoying their retirements.

At Temple Israel, Alan has served as President, Vice President, Financial Secretary, Co-Chair of the House Committee, and a member of the Finance Committee. Over the years, he has also served as President of Brotherhood and continues to serve on the Board of Trustees. He has also worked on Rabbinical Search, Ways & Means and Gala Committees, Memorial Wall and Tree of Life Refurbishments and the security and sound systems. On any given day, Alan can be found cleaning refrigerators, installing engraved leaves, hanging pictures, tightening pews, measuring spaces, cutting branches, putting up plaques, hanging Mezuzahs, or just being an "old Jew telling jokes".

Jodi currently holds a position on the Temple Board of Trustees and is a member of the Ritual and Aesthetics Committees and a long-time member of the Temple Israel Adult Choir. She has been the editor of the temple's monthly e-Bulletin since its creation in 2017. In a few weeks, she will be reprising her role as Sisterhood Co-President, a position she previously held from 2014-2021 and 2001-2004. Jodi is proud to have served as Co-Chair of the Annual Gala Committee for almost 20 years and is especially thrilled to have passed that torch on to Jesse Siegel! The design and installation projects of a new Memorial Wall and the refurbishment of the original Memorial Wall in the Temple Israel sanctuary were spearheaded by Jodi, in addition to a new Tree of Life in

the lobby. She has served on the School Board, Rabbinical and Cantorial Search Committees, and has coordinated more Passover Seders, Shabbat dinners, Festival lunches and fundraisers than she can remember.

Jodi has also taught the Confirmation Class, written and directed many Purim Schpiels, created hundreds of flyers and journal pages, for years sent out all acknowledgements for donations made in our Shabbat programs, and even spent one Yom Kippur afternoon trying to get blood out of the newly installed carpeting in the sanctuary. Of all her Temple accomplishments, Jodi is most proud to have been able to read from Temple Israel's Holocaust Torah and to have been able to chant Torah and Haftorah at High Holiday services—opportunities she may never have had at another synagogue.

Jodi and Alan are extremely grateful to the clergy and leadership of Temple Israel Reform Congregation of Staten Island for the Jewish education and religious experiences their family has had and for this very special honor; and, to Jesse Siegel, Claire Guttsman, Ann Targownik and their committees and to their fellow honorees, congregants, and their wonderful friends, who are truly family, for making this such a special day.
