A Message from Rabbi Howald



This year, Temple Israel and the state of Israel both celebrate the anniversary of their founding 75 years ago. They both arose out of the same inspiration: to provide a home for the Jewish people where we could be free to worship as we choose.

For both state and synagogue, the reaching of this milestone is an opportunity to celebrate and reflect. We rejoice because this longevity could not be taken for granted in 1948. We reflect because attaining three-quarters of a century naturally makes us look ahead to the next 25 years and beyond.

The Book of Genesis tells us that Abraham left his father's home with his wife Sarah at the age of 75. By the standards of today, 75 is an age of retirement from the world and its demands. By the benchmarks of the Torah, however, 75 was just the beginning of Abraham's and Sarah's journey to become the ultimate ancestors of the Jewish people. When he left his father's house in Haran at the age of 75, he still had the major adventures of his life ahead of him, including the Divine promise that he and his wife would found a mighty nation whose numbers would one day be more plentiful than the number of stars in the sky. For Abraham, 75 represented not the end of his life, but a new beginning full of promise and accomplishment. When Temple Israel began in 1948, this community didn't have a building or a history to call its own. 75 years later, the congregation has a place to worship, meet, and learn, surrounded by the many names of those whose generosity sustained this synagogue over multiple moves, a disastrous fire, demographic changes in the Jewish community and the challenges of designing, constructing, and maintaining its own building.

We could view the arrival of this 75th anniversary as a culmination of all these accomplishments and be content. Jewish tradition, on the other hand, asks us to view our 75th year, not as a finale, but as a new stage in our journey, full of adventure and discovery. So may it be for this congregation as we look forward to the years ahead!

Long ago, as Abraham left his father's house, he received God's promise to make his name great and source of blessing. As Temple Israel reaches its 75th year, these words should also inspire us.

May the journey ahead in the life of this congregation be filled with blessing for all those who sustain this community and may the renown of this synagogue continue to grow!

A Message from Cantor Bernstein



In 1998, when Temple Israel celebrated the 50th anniversary, I was completing my seventh year as your cantor. My children were eight and five, and our family was fully immersed in synagogue life. The Temple Israel choirs, which of course my daughters joined, sang at services, spiels,

nursing homes, the JCC, Project Hospitality, Snug Harbor, Staten Island Cable TV and even in a big Manhattan synagogue. Temple Israel was the center of my family's life, and through Temple we were part of Staten Island community life.

Twenty five years later much has changed in my family. One daughter is married; another has moved to a new city. I live in the village of Catskill, 30 miles south of Albany. And yet, here I am, back again at Temple Israel at this significant moment in the history of this great congregation. What an honor and a privilege it is to serve as your cantor in my post-retirement years, and see that Temple Israel continues to provide community and meaning to both long-time members who I know from back when, and those that I am meeting now. I find the new Avis Foundation initiatives to be especially exciting. There is no greater way to have hope for the future of Temple Israel, and our Jewish people than to sit on the bima at Tot Shabbat and see the excitement on the little ones' faces as they sing "Bim Bam Shabbat Shalom!"

To illustrate the importance of this 75 year milestone, I want to take you to another borough. After I left Temple Israel, I had the opportunity to be the spiritual leader of Progressive Temple Beth Ahavath Shalom in Boro Park, Brooklyn, affectionately known as PTBAS. The unwieldy name was the result of merger of the three historic Brooklyn congregations, including Temple Ahavath Sholom from Avenue R, where a number of Temple Israel congregants grew up. The congregation met in the building that had been Progressive Temple of Boro Park, which would have celebrated its 100th anniversary in 2019. In 2017, PTBAS decided to merge with another congregation, Beth Emeth, itself also a merger of three congregations. In 2018, one year shy of reaching its 100th birthday, the sanctuary of the last Reform congregation in Boro Park was razed to the ground to make way for condos.

On this happy occasion of the 75th anniversary, I tell you this cautionary tale of PTBAS because we cannot take the longevity of Temple Israel for granted. PTBAS' congregants were passionately devoted to their temple, but demographics and a dwindling membership made it impossible for a Reform congregation to continue in ultra-Orthodox Boro Park. PTBAS never reached their 100th anniversary. Temple Israel has reached this milestone 75th anniversary as the result of the dedication and hard work of the congregation, perhaps along with a bit of mazal. It will take more of that mazal and much more hard work and dedication to reach 100. Each fundraiser, each appeal takes Temple Israel one step closer, to assuring that Temple Israel remains the beacon of Reform Judaism on Staten Island for decades to come. Thank you for coming to the 75th anniversary party. Your support makes Temple Israel's mission a reality.

When I see the children of the children I prepared for bar and bat mitzvah, along with so many new, sweet young faces, coming up to the bima to sing "V'ahavta" with Rabbi Howald and me, I feel a great deal of hope that Temple Israel may reach 100 years and beyond.

"The old shall dream dreams, and the youth shall see visions give us time, give us strength, give us life!"

A Tribute to Rabbi Jay Brickman



In 1983, on Temple Israel's 35th Anniversary, Rabbi wrote to Siggy Kahn, "Please convey to the members of what has now become a most substantial synagogue, my warm felicitations.... I recall vividly being interviewed for the position [of rabbi].... The men were asking some very astute and penetrating questions with which I was

struggling manfully. Suddenly, Josie [Machol] interrupted the austere proceedings saying, "I think he's cute; let's take him!"

In 1949, he wrote to each founding member who returned for their second year. "To take a step into the darkness when there is nothing to depend on but faith in a far-off dream, takes courage. It was your trust and that of a handful of others which gave Temple Israel its being. If this feeling remains we will grow strong and move forward. And then what was once a dream will become a reality."

In 1998, Rabbi and his wife returned to Temple Israel to pray, study, teach, reminisce, dine and dance at our 50th Anniversary Celebration.



Following are excerpts from the obituary by Rob Golub, "Rabbi Brickman leaves behind decades of Jewish service, loving family."

Rabbi Jay Brickman, founder of Congregation Sinai in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, who had prolific interests and touched many lives, died Friday, January 7, 2022. He was 97.

Rabbi Brickman held a master's degree in Bible from University of Wisconsin-Madison, a master of Hebrew Letters, and an honorary doctor of divinity from the Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion.... He became a chaplain for the U.S. Army after World War II.

[At age 24] He was a founding rabbi for Temple Israel Reform Congregation of Staten Island.... He met his wife Rita there, may her memory be for a blessing. She was president of the Sisterhood.

Rabbi Brickman became the founding rabbi of Congregation Sinai in 1955...and its rabbi emeritus in the 1990's....

For many years, he personally taught each bar mitzvah at his home. He spent his decades deeply involved in a dizzying array of pursuits. He was an Eagle Scout. He played mandolin. He studied singing. He read plays at the JCC. He was active with the Democratic Party. He supported Milwaukee's socialist mayor. He published three books. He wrote daily one-liners on Twitter called "A Doodle a Day by Rabbi Jay." He gave sermons at the Unitarian Universalist Fellowship of Door County, where he also taught a summer Bible class. He studied basket weaving.... Nationally, he served on the editorial board for the Reform movement's High Holy Day prayerbook (Machzor), the *Gates of Repentance*."

A Tribute to Rabbi Marcus Kramer



I was nine years old when my father was hired by Temple Israel. I recall his office in the mansion that was our synagogue on Victory Boulevard. I was always impressed with my father's library from which he gathered so much wisdom, insight and integrity. I admired him for these qualities as did so many of his congregants.

Later, when I was older, after the building burnt down and a new synagogue was built on Forest Avenue, I developed other insights into my dad.

I listened to his sermons filled with the words of the ancient rabbis and how they applied to the present day. I observed his activities in the community – his compassion for the poor and downtrodden. One morning my father and I together protested in front of the building of a public school in a poor area without any minority workers. I recall his service to organizations like Family Service and the Urban League. In college, when I decided to follow in his footsteps, I think that he was shocked at first, but wrote me a beautiful letter about the joys of serving as a rabbi. I never had a father who played ball, with me, but how many sons can say they enjoyed studying Talmud with their fathers.

In his retirement, Marcus Kramer wrote an article for the Staten Island Advance until his demise.

There are two other people I must mention – my mother and my sister. My mother, Harriet, was the consummate rebbetzin of the 1950's and 60's. She was active in the Temple Israel Sisterhood and played a role in the dramas that were put on at the temple and the hostess with the mostest. She was always supportive of my father.

When I went on to college, my sister, Ellen, played an important part in reading and discussing my father's commentaries on the Bible. It was a joy that they shared together.

I look back at the career of Rabbi Marcus Kramer and am proud of what he accomplished serving Temple Israel and the Staten Island community.

Excerpts from obituary, Sun-Sentinel 2014:

Rabbi Milton Daniel Rosenfeld passed away on March 21, 2014 at the age of 93. He survived his wife and life partner of more than 60 years, Ruth Rabin Rosenfeld. ...

Rabbi Rosenfeld was ordained from Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion in 1960. He served as Rabbi to congregations in the New York City area, in Portsmouth, Virginia and in Davenport, Iowa.

While in Iowa he received his Doctor of Divinity for service in the community. He was passionate about helping young, disadvantaged youth become literate.

He was active in interfaith work in each community in which he lived.

While he was a Rabbi at Temple Israel in Staten Island, New York, he received a part-time appointment as Chaplin for the New York City Fire Department. In many ways he considered this his finest achievement.

He was a natural teacher and a wonderful rabbi. His gift of words pushed congregations, friends, and family alike to reflect on their actions and the important work of always striving to improve themselves and the world around them. He took the work of "Tikkun Olam" personally. Through his work, he set out to "repair the world."

A Message from Rabbi David A. Katz

I have the happiest memories of serving Temple Israel from 1988-2004.

In 1998 we celebrated the 50 th anniversary of the Temple's founding and it was a grand affair. We were fortunate to have with us the first rabbi to have served the Temple, Jay Brickman, then retired and living in Milwaukee. (Rabbi Brickman died just over a year ago at the age of 97.)

Excerpt from Rabbi's Jubilee Year Journal Message:

"Let us be strong for tasks still undone, for the demands that history is yet to make, for the testing of us and our children. In this place, may we draw near to Torah, may we draw near to our people, may we draw near to God." How busy we were during my tenure at the Temple!

I remember the hundreds who came to our Tu B'shevat seders, our vibrant committees, our Mitzvah Day that turned into Staten Island's "Community Days," I also remember the séance-like welcoming into our Sukkah of guests from ancient days, the zany Purim schpiels and stories told from the bimah about "Magic Pomegranates."

Most of all I remember all the people who made it happen our Cantor, who you are blessed to have serving you now, the many Presidents, Board members and the committee heads who strove for higher and higher standards.

I congratulate Temple Israel on the 75th anniversary of its founding and know that it will always remain the Jewish place to be.





Each Journal contribution helped meet Temple Israel's essential fundraising goals. Each message reminded us how Temple Israel remains so important and impactful in so many ways. We can trace our 75-year journey and now, we continue our journey into the decades ahead!

Our Journey Begins...

The following is based on Minutes of the founders' first meetings:

June 9, 1948—a warm Wednesday evening. A small group meets to share a vision, questions, disagreements; decisions, donations, friends, a future; prayer, celebrations, hardships; learning, and helping those in need. They seek a place, rabbi, choir, educators, volunteers, members, and funds.

Joseph Werb moves to establish a liberal progressive reform congregation on Staten Island. Questions: Arnold Schwartz – feasibility? Mrs. Stein – advisability? Siegfried Kahn – cost? The motion is passed. Temporary officers: Cornelius Bregoff, President; Dr. David Machol, VP; Carl Isaacs, Treasurer; Joseph Werb, Secretary.

And there was evening and a congregation, a first day.

The group meets the month. Membership will be \$35 per family, including High Holy Day seating. A school is planned, leading to Confirmation. Forty-four families have shown interest. Committees are formed. The name: Temple Israel Reform Congregation of Staten Island, located at 30 Bay Street, Staten Island NY, Room 306.

And there was a congregation and a name, a second day.

In September, Rabbi Jay Brickman is introduced: twenty-four years old, duly ordained, graduate of Columbia University and Jewish Institute of Religion; he had courses in psychiatry and philosophy and was a student rabbi in Palestine. He will devote weekends to the congregation and will be available for emergencies and holidays, with a salary of \$200 per month.

And there is a congregation, name, and rabbi, a third day.

By mid-September, arrangements are made for High Holy Day Service in a Sailor Snug Harbor chapel. Rabbi Brickman will bring a Torah. Mr. Mitzner will donate an ark. Mrs. Kempner will borrow a Jewish flag. Dr. Machol will handle prayerbooks and Torah storage. Mrs. Leo will make an altar cloth and curtains. Dr. Machol will assist with pulleys. Mrs. Klauber and Bellows will light the candles. Mrs. Brisk donates a Kiddush cup. Mr. Brisk and Dr. Machol will chair the greeting and ushering committee. Mrs. Kempner will ask her husband to blow the shofar. There will be no solicitation of funds. Mr. Bernstein remarks: if people are impressed with the beauty of the services, they will be happy to contribute.

And there was a congregation, name, rabbi, and High Holy Days, a fourth day.

There are ten students in Sunday School. Rabbi Brickman is administrator and principal. Mrs. Florence Werb is the teacher. Mothers of the children form a committee to assist. By Sept 29, 59 families have joined. The Treasurer reports a balance of \$1060. Fundraising is to be done through affairs such as a Hanukah Ball and by members voluntarily agreeing to increase their dues.

And there was a congregation, name, rabbi, High Holy Days, a school and funds, a fifth day.

And on the sixth day, they saw all that they had made, together.

In January, 1949 Temple Israel Reform Congregation of Staten Island received their charter of incorporation.

After a period renting space for services and classes, the founders purchased the Gans Estate, overlooking Silver Lake Park which served as a stately home from 1951 until 1959.

"Just as a bride is given a shower to start her new home, we had a kitchen shower...Pots, pans, serving utensils, towels, pot holders, a beautiful silver service which was used to serve coffee and tea every Friday night." - *Betty Kaplan, founder* "My family joined the Temple in 1953 so that my brother could prepare for his bar mitzvah....Because my father was raised Catholic and my mother Jewish, it must have been a difficult decision as to what religious training we would receive. Temple Israel was a perfect fit. Our family was quickly accepted.... Looking back now I wonder how different my life would have been if there was no Reform Congregation on Staten Island. I am glad that Temple Israel has continued to be welcoming to interfaith couples."— *Hon. Philip Straniere*

Our home— "designed to serve forever"

After the fire, Shabbat services were held in the Unitarian Church. High Holy Day services were held at the Snug Harbor Chapel (with Christian symbols discreetly covered). Rabbi Kramer and the congregation continued to pursue their dream.

In 2014, the congregation celebrated the 50th anniversary of the dedication of our building at 315 Forest Avenue. It has been a center for Reform Judaism on Staten Island, committed to its values, drawing upon both tradition and innovation. Temple Israel purchased a piece of land (with a stream, perfect for Tashlich) at 315 Forest Avenue at a City auction. Groundbreaking took place in 1962; the cornerstone was laid in 1963; the award-winning building, designed by Percival Goodman, was dedicated on September 27, 1964.



By the 1990's, the condition of the roof, roof railings, laminated wood beams, paving, bathrooms, social hall finishes, and air-conditioning system all required repair/replacement. A capital campaign was launched: .

"The NEXT GENERATION Fund: Their challenge was to build it. Ours is to preserve and enhance what they built."

Though not required by secular law, plans and funds were committed for **Lehiyot: Access to Judaism**. A restroom was constructed on the social hall/sanctuary level, and a wheelchair lift was installed to connect all three levels.

"In 1993, breaking new ground, Rabbi Katz created a bar mitzvah service for our special needs son Gregory, who is non-verbal. ... the Temple remains committed to providing access for persons with disabilities." - *Hon. Philip Straniere*
