January 20, Part One, The Torah & the Tanakh
February 3, Part Two, The Mishnah & the Talmud

In this two-part class, participants will gain a clear and accessible understanding of Judaism's central texts and how they are organized, studied, and interpreted.

We will explore the composition and organization of the Tanakh - the Hebrew Bible. We'll discuss how the books are arranged, when various parts of the Hebrew Bible are read throughout the Jewish calendar, and who wrote each book, according to rabbinic tradition.

Building on the foundation of the written Torah, the second session introduces the Oral Torah—Judaism's vast tradition of commentary, debate, and law preserved in the Mishnah and Talmud. We'll examine what the Mishnah is, how the Talmud expands upon it, and how the Talmud is structured, studied, and used in Jewish learning. Participants will learn to “read” a Talmud page, recognize its layers of text and commentary, and appreciate the intellectual and spiritual depth of rabbinic discourse.
